The Annual Christmas Party is scheduled on December 15, 2007 at the Sons of Italy in Lawrence, MA.

"Our Annual Christmas Party has been very successful in the past, and the smiles that we see on the children's faces every Christmas are priceless. We have high hopes for this new program to better serve the foster children and their foster families." stated Larry Giordano, President and Founder of the Foster Kids of the Merrimack Valley. "Last year we provided toys and gifts for 95 children and their respective foster mother's. We are hoping that we can raise the bar this year by inviting our community to be a Santa's Helper and show these kids how much our Merrimack Valley community cares."

What is a Santa's Helper?

We are looking for volunteers including businesses and/or individuals, to sign up to be a Santa's Helper and bring joy to a foster child this holiday season. A Santa's Helper will be anonymously assigned a child and will receive a personal wish list from that child that includes one personal item (i.e., Red Sox sweatshirt) and one age appropriate toy.

The children participating in this program are currently foster children under the care of the Department of Social Services (DSS) in the Merrimack Valley, including Lawrence, Methuen, Andover, and North Andover, ranging from birth to 18 years of age.

The average price estimate per child is \$100. Individuals, groups, or businesses may sign up to sponsor one child or more. Cash donations are accepted in lieu of receiving a Christmas wish list.

Program Details:

October: The sign up process when businesses and individuals volunteer to become a Santa's Helper.

November: Each Santa's Helper will be assigned a child and receive a wish list that will provide the gender and age of the child.

December 1st: All gifts are due and can be dropped off at two locations:
